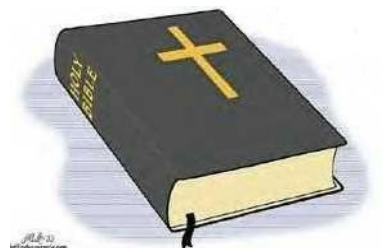

The Respect for Life Corner

“Under the constant influence of a rationalist and secularist philosophy which makes man, instead of God, the measure of what is right and good, many have become confused about the most basic truths, for example, the inviolable dignity of innocent human life, from the moment of conception to the moment of natural death, and the integrity of marriage between one man and one woman as the first and irreplaceable cell of the life of society. If Christians fail to articulate and uphold natural moral law, then they fail in the fundamental duty of patriotism, of loving their country by serving the common good.” ~ (Cardinal Raymond L. Burke, Prefect of the Supreme Tribunal of the Apostolic Signatura, Address to the World Prayer Congress for Life V, Oct. 9, 2010)

Please take a moment and slowly re-read Cardinal Burke's powerful pro-life statement. We can be proud that the Catholic Church is on the fore-front of the pro-life message in our society. His message points out the fallacy that the policy of separation of church and state means that we must separate God's natural law from enacting state law based on the 'will of the people.' The dignity of the human person is based on God's law and the fact that we are made in His image and likeness, from the moment of our conception until our last breath; and no man-made law can alter this fact. When you hear someone, especially a politician say, "I don't personally believe in abortion/ euthanasia, but I do not believe I have the right to force my opinion on others," it is the first clue that they refuse to acknowledge God's primacy in all law. The irony is that this thought process is rooted in the false concept of separation of church and state but in fact is a violation of the 1st fundamental duty of patriotism; that of doing the morally correct thing in God's eyes because you do love your country and want to make sure it follows God's plan and not any fallible human plan.

This misunderstanding also applies to the doctors and nurses who perform abortions because they believe they are "saving women's lives." So many women who are already frightened by an unwanted pregnancy are misled and misinformed about the true nature of abortion and then pressured into having one. They are told: "It's a fetus, it's not a person."

It is a person! Her heart beats 18 days after she is conceived. All her body systems are present by 8 weeks

and she can suck her thumb. By 12 weeks she is fully formed, fingernails and all.

The Roe v. Wade decision was not written to give women the right to choose what happens to their body, rather, it was man's decision to usurp God's law by pronouncing when a person becomes a person. We read in the Gospel and pray in the 2nd Joyful Mystery of the Rosary that St John leaped in his mother's womb at the Visitation...a 6-month old baby acknowledging the presence of a newly conceived baby, our Lord, Jesus Christ. This is the 1st argument against the morality of abortion and certainly the most pointed; there are many others.

Twenty-four organic vegetable gardens, whose yield will go towards providing food for the Salvation Army soup kitchen and Christian Community Action's food pantry, were dedicated on Wednesday morning, July 6, on land provided by the Upper Trinity Regional Water District at 900 N. Kealy in Lewisville. Denton County Commissioner Bobbie Mitchell provided the invocation, Lewisville Mayor Dean Ueckert praised the charitable effort and Brother Knight Deacon Ray Lamarre of St. Philip the Apostle Catholic Church & Knight-Light Charities blessed the gardens.

Knights Brian Friesenhahn, Sean McIntyre, Jay Darling, Pete Whelan, and Glenn Mutz pitched in to complete soil preparation on the Council's garden plot on a hot Saturday morning, July 9. Care on the 48-square-foot organic garden will continue throughout this year, with a harvest planned in the fall.


