### **“To the Passenger Now Flying the Plane: Listen to My Voice:**

An attorney turned preacher tells a story that I would like to share with you today, albeit it has been edited greatly for the sake of time. Some of you may already be familiar so keep in mind I'm editing.

Mr. David Gibbs and a colleague were at an airport in Alaska waiting to board their plane to Anchorage when a Christian pastor, who was also a licensed pilot, approached the men and offered them a free ride to Anchorage in his small plane. They could keep their airline tickets for a future trip; this flight would not cost anything.

They accepted his offer, climbed into the small plane and took off. Shortly after takeoff the pastor-pilot turns to the two men and tells them that when they reach the clouds, he, the pilot, always passes out. They will need to fly the plane if that happens. Moments later they enter the clouds and, sure enough, the pilot faints.

They tried shaking him to wake him up but to no avail. Mr. Gibbs and his friend had never taken flying lessons and were not sure what to do. One of them sees the radio, grabs the mic and begins calling for help. Someone, somewhere, responds on the radio. Mr. Gibbs explains the very dire situation. The person on the other end was a pilot heading from Anchorage to Japan. He is very calm and tells them:

*“I'm a freighter flying out of Anchorage on the way to Tokyo. I'm going to start circling so I don't lose you otherwise I'll fly out of range of your radio and you won't hear me anymore.”*

The freighter pilot was able to get Anchorage Emergency on the radio and they were able to try to help attorney Gibbs in his situation. Mr. Gibbs continues the story: “I'll never forget what this man at Anchorage Emergency said, he said, *‘My job is to get you home safe, but here's the deal, if you want me to get you home safe you have to promise me, you'll obey my voice. You can't see me, but I can see you and if you don't obey my voice you are going to die.’*”

The voice crackled over the radio again and said, *“You're four minutes from a mountain. You're going to crash into that mountain and die unless you follow my voice.”*

Mr. Gibbs never said anything like: “I have to follow your voice? Is that reasonable? That sounds so silly?” No, their lives were in danger and the two men understood that without that voice they had nothing.

With the help of the voice on the radio they were able to get turned around and the control tower froze all the traffic in the area. The voice continued, *“It's going to take me an hour and a half to get you to Anchorage and there is some bad weather ahead. But listen carefully, don't pay attention to the weather; I want you to just hear and focus on my voice. If you start watching the storm you will die.”*

Sure, enough the storm came, the turbulence was rough, the thunder crashed, the lightning flashed but that voice, that one calm and steady voice, kept giving instructions on how to steer the craft, what buttons to push, levers to pull, what to watch for and on and on they flew ***listening to that voice.***

Occasionally, they would hear one of the grounded pilots, grounded because of this emergency, encouraging Mr. Gibbs and his friend, *“You've got this!”*, *“God bless you; we are all down here praying for you.”* *“Just listen to the voice; he will get you home safely.”* But there was the voice, a distinct voice, that when they obeyed and listened, kept the plane flying even in the worst weather they faced that night. Finally, the voice said, *“I'm going to line you up and bring you in right down the runway.”* He told him what lights to watch for and what to do every step of the way. Although they know the voice is now bringing them down, the two men in the plane can't see anything but the lights of the runway. But they listened; they obeyed; and they lived. The voice got them back home safely. The plane came to a stop and then the pilot woke up.

There are numerous lessons for us in this story and on this day, at this hour, it is important for all of us to consider:

The world is filled with so many voices, so many chaotic voices. Voices that lead to sin and to, well, anywhere but back Home to Heaven. Thus, we need to listen to that One voice who will bring us Home safely: the voice of God.

But we need to know which voice is His, the voice of God. We must learn to recognize that solitary voice, so calm, steady, confident, firm. If we listen to His voice above all other voices - those voices of anger, disobedience, confusion, gossip, etc. - we will not die but instead we will live because that voice can only lead us to right choices and decisions in our lives. It must come, though, at a cost. The cost of obedience, humility, a desire and yearning to unite our voice with His voice.

Perhaps some of us feel like we've lost touch with His voice and before we knew it, we'd let our lives and relationships spin out of control. Perhaps we've been listening to all the wrong voices and now find that we've fallen into old patterns of sin that steer us further and further away from God, leading us to our own personal destruction. And, perhaps, there are some among us who have not heard His voice clearly for so long that we fear may never hear it again.

As we prepare for, and enter into, the Season of Advent, there is hope. That voice has never stopped speaking to you or I. That voice has always been there encouraging us, instructing us, and believing in us.

It's not too late to take some quiet time in prayer to simply listen once again. To listen with our spiritual ears.

We may not see the voice but He sees us. All the more important for us to listen and obey... He can see the mountain up ahead that we cannot see; He can see the many, many storms yet to come in our lives; and He can see us striving to hear His voice once again.

God speaks to us through His Word; through the Sacraments; through the holy people he brings into our lives; and He speaks to us by the power of His Holy Spirit. We must obey His voice, obey His Word, even though we may not physically see Him.

If we truly are like sheep in a flock, let us reflect on John 10:27: “My sheep hear my voice; I know them, and they follow me.”

May we all strive to ***know the voice of*** our Shepherd ***by knowing*** the Shepherd. May we all recognize and follow obediently that voice... to lead us, to guide us, to bring us back Home.

## SUPREME CHAPLAIN'S MONTHLY

**“For it is through the Holy Spirit that this child has been conceived in her. She will bear a son and you are to name him Jesus, because he will save his people from their sins.”** (Gospel for Dec. 18, Mt 1:20-21) Does the Advent season sometimes seem to be about things other than Christ? Amid breathless advertisements, urgent warnings about the waning number of shopping days and the hassle of making holiday plans, there's a danger that Jesus' birth will be neglected or forgotten. How do you “Keep Christ in Christmas” in your own life? Do you practice any Christmas traditions that help you do this? Could you establish any new traditions that will remind you what Christmas is all about?
