The Advent Stations of the Cross

Brothers.

How this year has passed so quickly. Advent will soon be upon us. With Advent the Church begins something new: a new Liturgical Year.

To help us prepare for the Advent journey, I will be offering a prayerful hour of reflection titled: "The Advent Stations of the Cross."

What are The Advent Stations of the Cross?

The Advent Stations take us on a tour of the Old Testament. Like the traditional Lenten Stations of the Cross, these seven Advent "stations" or "stopping points" provide a way to reflect upon the mystery of how God prepared the world to receive his Son at the moment of the Annunciation.

Each station contains:

- an Old Testament foreshadowing of the incarnation
- a meditation
- the New Testament fulfillment in Christ
- a prayer

For the purpose of our meditation for the General Meeting as well as the upcoming newsletter, I'll share part of the meditation from the first and last stations and identify the other five stations along the way:

First Advent Station - The Creation of Adam and Eve

Meditation: In the wonders of creation the Lord revealed his great love by creating man in his own image and likeness. By the sin of Adam and Eve though, that image was disfigured and the likeness was dimmed. The beauty of man was hidden behind his sin. But even before Adam and Eve were banished from the garden the Lord was preparing the world to receive the gift of his Son. This is the mystery of Advent -- preparing for his coming. This is the mystery of the incarnation -- preparing for Christ to make all things new.

The Second Advent Station is: The Covenant Begins

The Third Advent Station is: The Angelic Announcement

The Fourth Advent Station is: The Destiny of Bethlehem

The Fifth Advent Station is: The Song of Praise

The Sixth Advent Station is: David's Promise to Bathsheba

The Seventh Advent Station is: The Birth of the Virgin Mary

Meditation: Let us take a moment to compare:

The 'ark of Noah' was built to save mankind from the deadly force of the flood; The 'New Ark', who is the Blessed Virgin Mary, was built to safely bring into the world the One who would save mankind from eternal damnation.

The 'ark of Noah' was built with precision and care, for the ark would be Noah's only refuge. The 'new Ark' who is the Blessed Virgin Mary, was created with even greater care and precision, for not just one family would find safety within her but <u>all</u> families.

The 'ark of Noah' would deliver his family from physical death and destruction; the 'New Ark', who is the Blessed Virgin Mary, would bring into the world the One who would deliver all mankind from eternal death.

From the 'ark of Noah' a dove flew out and brought back an olive branch; from the 'new Ark', who is the Blessed Virgin Mary, is not just a simple olive branch, but the very root and stem of Jesse.

As we begin to sense the last of this year winding down, may we make time to be quiet and still, asking the Holy Spirit to show each of us if there are any spiritual matters that need the attention of the Sacrament of Reconciliation and, if so, to follow up and receive this great Sacrament.

What a beautiful way to prepare for Advent. With Advent we begin something new. May we all begin Advent with something new as well: spiritual hearts that are pure from the marks of sin; hearts filled with gratitude, thanksgiving, and love.

• SUPREME CHAPLAIN'S MONTHLY

"Amen, I say to you, this poor widow put in more than all the other contributors to the treasury. For they have all contributed from their surplus wealth, but she, from her poverty, has contributed all she had, her whole livelihood."

(Gospel for Nov. 7, Mk 12:43-44)

"Give until it hurts" might seem like a tired old cliché, but it has merit nonetheless. It's fairly easy to give from our excess — what we don't really need — but real sacrifice begins when we go beyond that. The widow in the parable, in giving what to many people would be a bit of loose change, offered a more meaningful gift than the wealthy who donated far larger sums they would hardly miss. But there's another layer of meaning here: Unlike the wealthy, the widow gave everything she had to God and put her trust completely in his divine providence. May we recognize that she made the wiser investment.

Challenge by Supreme Chaplain Archbishop William E. Lori:

This month, I challenge you to review your charitable giving and to pray about whether God is asking you to contribute something more. Second, I challenge you to participate in your council's Food for Families or Coats for Kids Faith in Action program.

Questions for Reflection:

• How does God wish you to balance providing for yourself and your family with serving others? Do you find you put your trust in material goods and wealth, rather than in God? What are some specific, concrete ways you might do better at sharing your blessings with the less fortunate?

Insurance Agent—Robert Sibug

My job is to meet with every member at least once a year to complete or update his Knights of Columbus Family Service Record. That means I need to set an appointment with him together with his wife (if he is married) and meet for about an hour. For a first-time meeting with a new member, the purpose is to complete the Family Service Record. Subsequent yearly meetings will be to update it.

For new members, sometimes a call from the Field Agent becomes a surprise because they were never told about the reason why Blessed Michael McGivney organized the Knights of Columbus. And in order to fulfill the main goal of the Order, a Field Agent needs to meet with every member.

It might interest everyone to know that there are 4 classifications of members in the Knights of Columbus: associate, insurance, prior and inactive. A member starts out as an associate member. When he participates in the insurance program by buying for himself one of the products, he becomes an insurance member. Note that, if a member buys insurance for his wife and his children age 18 or less but does not buy any for himself, he remains an associate member. A prior member is an associate member who is no longer in good standing. Finally, an inactive member is one who bought insurance for himself but is no longer in good standing.

To go back to the subject of this discussion, annual reviews are to be conducted for associate, insurance and inactive members. For insurance and inactive members, the goal is to review and service the policies they own. In addition, because change constantly happens in our lives, some updates may be needed on the policies as well as the Family Service Record. An example is the assignment of contingent owners. Another example is the update of beneficiaries.

Sometimes, term policies are fully or partially converted to either whole life policies or universal policies. In the case of associate members, sometimes some of them finally decide to buy insurance for themselves.

Some members decline a meeting with a Field Agent because they say "they're all set". Just today, I met with an 85-year-old insurance member who has not done a review for many years. Of course, he did not say that he was all set. But during the meeting, we found out that he was not all set after all because all 7 policies that he owns for his children did not have contingent owners.

Brothers, I do not want to overemphasize the need for an annual review or even the need for an initial meeting with a Field Agent if you are new member. Even if all your policies are with another

commercial company? Yes, even if all your policies are with another commercial company. You may not know what you do not know.
