Brother Knights and Families

"So, by their fruits you will know them. Not everyone who says to me, 'Lord, Lord,' will enter the kingdom of heaven, but only the one who does the will of my Father in heaven." (Matt 7:20-21)

Spiritual Practices and Devotions for February

The month of February is traditionally dedicated to Holy Family: Jesus, Mary, and Joseph. Consider adding the following to your spiritual practices this month:

- Consecrate, or reconsecrate, your family to the Holy Family by praying the Consecration to the Holy Family every day.
- Invite your family members to join in one of your spiritual practices every day.
- Try to have dinner with your family as often as possible this month. Say grace with them before the meal begins. Encourage your family members to prepare dinner and clean up together, too, if they are able to do so.

Eucharistic Revival

- Pray the Rosary the 13th of each month for the success of the Revival and an increase to Christ in the Eucharist.
- Find and practice another Eucharistic devotion.

<u>Presentation of Our Lord (February 2):</u> The Presentation of the Lord occurs forty days after the birth of Jesus. Read Luke 2:22-35, the account of the Presentation including the Canticle of Simeon.

St. Paul Miki and Companions (February 6): Paul Miki was a Japanese Jesuit Brother, who, with his companions, was martyred in 1597. He was forced to walk 600 miles, tied to a cross, and then was run through with a spear. Despite all that, he gave glory to God and forgave his executioners. Recall his story and pray for his intercession when you are called to offer forgiveness, especially to family members.

Lent: The three traditional practices for Lent are Prayer, Fasting, and Almsgiving. When you're choosing to "do something" or "give something up" for Lent, make sure that you have a plan in each practice. Lent begins with Ash Wednesday, February 14, which is a day of fasting.

A Simple Gesture, a Powerful Statement

Brothers, We all know that Christianity is under attack in the United States of America. Some would argue that it is Catholicism in particular that is attacked at every turn. Growing up I never, ever, thought I would utter those words. But we know it to be true. We live in a society where more and more people are finding ways to be "offended", especially when someone displays any action deemed "Christian" or promotes Christian morals and values.

Several years ago, I was giving a presentation at St. Mark's about 'Political Correctness' and I half-heartedly said that the day is coming when we will not be allowed to make the *Sign of the Cross* in public, like at a restaurant, because it will be deemed "too offensive" or even "hostile" to non-Christian patrons who might be present.

As I finished that statement a man raised his hand, and he shared an experience he and his family were subject to just the night before at a restaurant here in San Antonio.

When their meals were brought to their table, they made the *Sign of the Cross* and were about to bow their heads and offer a blessing when the couple seated at the next table apparently took exception to this simple gesture.

The couple stood, picked up their own plates and utensils, glared at them in disgust, and then moved themselves to the farthest table they found. The headdress of the woman was one commonly worn by, and associated with, another World Religion.

The family continued on with their prayer but during the meal the couple had to explain to their small children what had just happened, as it was confusing to them.

So just what is our Sign of the Cross? What is its origin and significance?

The Sign of the Cross is a very ancient practice and prayer. We don't have any indication of it in Scripture, but, in the fourth century, St. Basil said that we learned the Sign from the time of the Apostles and that it was administered in Baptisms.

I'd like to share 6 meanings of the Sign of the Cross:

1 - A confession of faith.

When we make the *Sign of the Cross* we are professing a mini version of the Creed - we are professing our belief in the Father, and in the Son and in the Holy Spirit. When we say the words and pray in someone's name - as in the name of the Trinity - we are declaring their presence and coming into their presence - that's how a name is used in Scripture.

2 - A renewal of our Baptism.

As a sacramental, meaning sacred signs which remind us of the sacraments, the Sign of the Cross is a renewal of the Sacrament of Baptism. When we make it we say again, in effect, "I died with Christ and rose to new life." The Sign of the Cross in Baptism links us to the Body of Christ, and when we make it we remember our joining to that Body with Christ as the head.

3 - A mark of discipleship.

In *Luke 9:23* Jesus says, "If any man will come after me, let him deny himself, and take up his cross daily, and follow me." The word that the Fathers of the Church used for the *Sign of the Cross* is a Greek word denoting ownership that is the same as what a slave owner put on a slave, a shepherd put on a sheep and a general put on a soldier - and for us, it's a declaration that I belong to Christ.

By making the *Sign of the Cross* we are saying to the Lord, "I want to obey you; I belong to you. You direct all my decisions. I will always be obedient to God's law, Christ's teachings and the Church."

4 - An acceptance of suffering.

When suffering comes, the Sign of the Cross is a sign of acceptance. It's remembering that Jesus became a man and suffered for us and that we participate in Christ's suffering. The Sign of the Cross says, "I am willing to embrace suffering in order to share in Christ's suffering."

When we're suffering, when we're feeling like God is not there, the *Sign of the Cross* brings Him into that situation and declares His presence whether we feel it or not. It is a way of acknowledging Him and His presence during that time of trial.

5 - A defense against the devil.

One of the main teachings of the early Church Fathers is that the *Sign of the Cross* is a declaration of defense against the devil. When we sign ourselves, we declare to the devil, "I belong to Christ; He is my protection."

6 - A victory over self-indulgence.

The *Sign of the Cross* is a way to put to death self-indulgence - those big problems and temptations we have, the stubborn things we can't get rid of. The Church Fathers say if we are angry, full of lust, fearful, overly emotional, or grappling with fleshly temptations, make the Sign when tempted and it will help dispel the problem.

When we enter Mass and make the *Sign of the Cross*, we are reminding ourselves that we are baptized Christians and we are authorized to participate in the Sacrifice of the Mass. When we do the same as we are leaving the church, we are reminding ourselves that the Mass never ends, that our lives are meant to be a participation in the Sacrifice not just when we are in Church, but in our everyday lives.

As with the story I shared at the beginning, the public display of anything and everything Christian is under withering attack. We can either *be afraid of public criticism* or we can *boldly and confidently show our faith* in the face of possible criticism. As Knights we should proudly show our faith when in public and perhaps the easiest way is to remember to offer a blessing for our meal when out at a restaurant, and to begin with the *Sign of the Cross*, not simply bow our heads as others might. The *Sign of the Cross* sets us apart.

About a week after the man at St. Mark's shared his story I was at Costco in Selma and, as I was leaving, I noticed a couple in the Food Court who were about to eat whatever it was they purchased. They made the *Sign of the Cross* and offered a blessing. I waited until they were finished and then walked over, introduced myself as a fellow Catholic,

and I thanked them for being a public witness to our Faith. They were parishioners of OLPH and we wound up having a brief but wonderful conversation.

When in the public square, there will be moments whereby we will make one of these two choices: we will choose to "fit in" with the rest of society, or we will choose to "stand out" from the crowd.

Before we should ever allow fear to cause us to cower, let us commit to memory these words from St. Paul to Timothy: For this reason, I remind you to stir into flame the gift of God that you have through the imposition of my hands. ⁷ For God did not give us a spirit of cowardice but rather of power and love and self-control. ⁸ So do not be ashamed of your testimony to our Lord, nor of me, a prisoner for his sake; but bear your share of hardship for the gospel with the strength that comes from God. - II Timothy 1:6-8

We do not cower. We do not hide. We do not fear. Brothers, we're better than that. We are Knights. May we always be proud to *stand out* from the crowd, to *stand up* for the Gospel of Jesus Christ, and to *stand strongly united*, as we *share our faith* even in simple ways.

The Sign of the Cross... a simple gesture, but what a powerful statement it makes.

This Month's Challenge
