Spiritual Practices and Devotions for December

The month of December is traditionally dedicated to the Immaculate Conception. Consider adding the following to your spiritual practices this month:

Advent

Advent begins on December 3rd and is a four-week period of preparation for the birth of Jesus at Christmas. It is a time to remember Jesus' first coming when he was born in Bethlehem, a time to repent and prepare for the second coming of Jesus at the end of time when he will judge the living and the dead, and a time to open our hearts and our eyes to recognize the "middle coming" of Jesus in our daily lives, both in the sacraments and in our neighbors.

- Read the Gospel of Luke; there are 24 chapters in the Gospel of Luke, so if you read one per day, you will be done by Christmas
- Make a plan to go to Confession
- Have an Advent wreath in your home and light a new candle each Sunday

St. Juan Diego (December 9): On 9 December 1531, when Juan Diego was on his way to morning Mass, the Blessed Mother appeared to him on Tepeyac Hill, the outskirts of what is now Mexico City. Learn more about the story of Juan Diego by visiting www.kofc.org/guadalupe.

Our Lady of Guadalupe (December 12): The Knights of Columbus are consecrated to Our Lady of Guadalupe. Mark this day with particular devotion by praying the Rosary. Learn more about the story of Our Lady of Guadalupe by visiting www.kofc.org/guadalupe.

Las Posadas (December 16-24): This religious festival celebrated in Mexico and some parts of the United States commemorates the journey that Joseph and Mary made from Nazareth to Bethlehem in search of a safe refuge where Mary could give birth to the baby Jesus. Christmas (December 25): Remember to keep Christ in Christmas! As Catholics, the celebration of Christmas only begins on December 25th! Christmas has an Octave, which means that the 8 days after Christmas should be celebrated as an extension of Christmas Day. Find small ways to keep the joy of Christmas alive in your home.

Christmas markets, Christmas dinners with friends, secret Santa, mince pies, Elf on the Shelf, Christmas Carol services, and time with family and friends: these are some of my fondest memories of Christmas. They are what brought me joy and solace in a time of year when I often felt lonely, low and disheartened.

While people worried about the presents being just right, who is going to invite whom for Christmas dinner, and what they would wear, I worried about the long dark nights that enveloped me into a pit of sadness, the time spent missing family and, ultimately, pining for what Christmas used to be when I was younger.

Youthful Christmases were full of exciting presents that Santa brought me, like my bicycle or trampoline; they were about joy, parties, and most of all family. As time marched on, our family became smaller and the presents were no longer what I wanted for Christmas. I wanted those who could no longer be there.

This year, it feels that this is what the whole nation wants for Christmas, a few days or even hours with their loved ones, especially those who are no longer with us at all. We are together in our desire to be with those who are apart from us.

Unfortunately, for many of us, that's not possible. The hope and joy that we are 'supposed' to feel at this time of year seems harder to grasp.

I have been reminded, in the darkness of these past few years, that it is in the darkest night you see the stars shine most brightly. In the depths of the dark nights, the shepherds and the Magi followed the brightest star. And it was this star that guided them to a new beginning and a new hope.

It may feel superficial in our current world, to look to the brightest star, the true shining light of Christmas – Jesus the newborn, the infant, the child.

But I believe it is because of the state of the world we must look to Jesus. It is in the coming of Jesus we find a new beginning, a new life, and a renewed sense of hope. This story reminds me of a children's Christmas pageant performed at a church in the Hill Country not too many years ago.

Little 7-year-old Samantha was beaming with excitement when her mom picked her up at church the Sunday afternoon following Thanksgiving. "Mommy! Mommy! Guess

what? I got the most important role in the Christmas pageant this year! The most important part!!"

When her mother inquired, Samantha told her, "It's a secret. You'll find out when we do the play for the parish."

The weeks went by very quickly and now it was time for the Nativity Story. During the course of the play, her mother was able to rule out the following parts: Samantha was not playing the part of the Baby Jesus; nor the part of the Blessed Mother; not a shepherd and not one of the animals. Her mother recognized all of those children. But there was one role that had come up earlier but she could not see who the child was. Perhaps this is Samantha's role?

Alas, at the conclusion of the play the children were all being introduced to the parishioners and sure enough, Samantha had played the role of the Christmas star.

When the family had gathered in the car to go home, Samantha could not contain her excitement and, as one might expect, the family lauded praise on her acting abilities (and, as her little brother pointed out, her ability to not trip and fall with this giant star affixed to her).

The voices in the car began to quiet down as they continued their drive home. Little brother had just one more burning question: "Hey Samantha. You said you had the most important role in the play. You just played a big star and had no spoken parts. How was that the most important role in the play?"

Without hesitation Samantha responded: "Duh. No one knew where to find Baby Jesus. It was the star that led everyone to Jesus. Without the star, they might still be out there looking for Him. Without the star they wouldn't have found Jesus. So that makes the star the most important role of the play." Hard to argue with that logic.

What about you and I? Have we ever considered how, during this holiday season, we might be that star leading others to Jesus? The shiniest presents begin to dull over time, the latest and greatest gadgets are soon replaced by better versions of the latest and greatest gadgets as technology evolves, and many precious, one-of-a-kind individualized gifts are simply way beyond many peoples budgets this year.

How about giving loved ones and friends a gift that costs no money, remains shiny forever, and a gift that no amount of technology can compete with. How about the gift of leading others to Jesus this Christmas. The most important role in the Nativity Story surely was that star. This year, let's all be stars... stars that lead others to Jesus.
