#### *Spiritual Practices and Devotion for June*

The month of June is traditionally dedicated to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. Consider adding the following to your spiritual practices this month;

#### Corpus Christi (June 11)

This feast dedicated to the Most Holy Eucharist should inspired us to increase our devotion to Jesus in the Eucharist. Participate in your parish's Eucharistic Procession. Schedule a time to visit the Blessed Sacrament during the week.

#### The Most Sacred Heart of Jesus (June 16)

Blessed Michael McGivney had a deep devotion to the Sacred Heart of Jesus. This devotion was popularized in the 1670's, when Jesus appeared to St. Margaret Alacoque, a nun in France. In these visions, Jesus told her how He wished to be honored with the symbol of His heart, asking for the faithful to repent of their sins, receive Communion frequently, and observe the Holy Hour. Go to Mass or make an act of Spiritual Communion this week.

#### Immaculate Heart of Mary (June 17)

Devotion to the Immaculate Heart of Mary is an ancient custom, tied to a passage from the Gospel of Luke that speaks of Mary's heart, "and a sword will pierce through your own soul also, that thoughts out of many hearts may be revealed." (Luke 2:35). Pray an extra decade of the Rosary this week.

**“Let the Fire Fall” - Lecturer’s Report, SK Dan Dúet**  
**KC Council 5863 General Meeting May 2023 and Newsletter June 2023**

With Pentecost fast approaching I’d like to sing a prayer to the Holy Spirit as my Lecturer’s Report. Some of you may have heard this song if you’ve been on an ACTS retreat or Cursillo Weekend, or if you attended the SA Men’s Conferences in the early years when I served as music leader. In any of these instances you probably heard it as a hand-clapping, foot-stomping kind of song. But I’ve always enjoyed singing it as a meditative type of prayer.

The song is titled, “Let the Fire Fall” and there are only three very short verses:

“Holy Spirit, come with your fire.”  
(During the Sacrament of Baptism, we receive the Holy Spirit.)

“Holy Spirit, purify my heart.”  
(During the Sacrament of Reconciliation our souls are made pure once again.)

“Holy Spirit, set my life on fire.”  
(During the Sacrament of Confirmation, we invite the Holy Spirit to reign in and over our lives; to be filled with the exact same zeal as the Apostles on the day of Pentecost.)

If you know “about” the Holy Spirit but don’t feel like you necessarily “know” the Holy Spirit in a personal way like knowing Jesus in a personal way, I encourage you to be open and ask the Holy Spirit to come to you and to reveal Himself in a real and personal way during the course of this sung prayer here tonight.
