## From the Texas State Council:

### Let's get it done. Back to Basics, No Excuses

#### State Chaplains Message: "A question is probably just a question"

I remember attending a workshop given by Father John Kemper in the early 2000s focused on the theme of teaching Gen X-ers. At the time I was teaching in a seminary, and it seemed that often we teachers would enter into conversations about the "young seminarians" and how hard it was for us to understand them. I still have my notes from the talk that day, and the memory I want to share with you is that he told us, "When a student asks a question, it probably *is* just a question."

That observation wouldn't appear to be so enlightening to many people, but for someone who often perceived a question as a challenge to authority, it changed my way of looking at questions. For example, I realized that if a seminarian asked me why I celebrated the Mass in a certain way, I simply needed to respond to the question.

One of the "Ten Themes" listed in section 5.4 of the *Vademecum* for the Synodal Process observes that, "Listening is the first step, but it requires an open mind and heart, without prejudice."

One way to look at this theme is to consider the areas in which I may have closed my mind and heart to another person or group, and even judged them before they opened their mouth to ask a question. Using the story mentioned above, we could ask ourselves, "How do I listen to those in my 'classroom?'" and then follow with, "What are the labels or judgments I have placed on them?" and, "Who do I keep out of the 'classroom?'"

The most basic attempt at the first question might reveal that there is a tendency to listen more closely to those who agree with me. A tendency to shut down an alternate view or even a simple question, maybe without even realizing it, also could develop. Henri Nouwen wrote about this spiritual problem years ago in his book *Reaching Out*, observing how often a teacher spends time answering questions that aren't being asked.

Nouwen called for a spiritual movement in the classroom towards hospitality, in which students can be heard and appreciated for the questions they present. This image of the classroom can serve as an image for the different levels of relationships in my life. It could be at work or at home, in the larger community of schools and civic involvements, even in the Church.

The process of *synodality* has been challenging each of us to not immediately shut down any voice, and to listen to the questions that are being asked. In the process, I am becoming aware of my pre-conceptions and judgments. I'm learning to listen without immediately responding. The process challenges each of us to come to a greater appreciation of whom we have been cutting off or whom we may be talking about in a

dismissive way. The process reminds each of us that often we don't need to give an answer; we can simply sit and acknowledge another person's humanity.

Beyond the people I may have been dismissing in my environment are those I don't even know. It could be different cultures, languages, political views, ages, experiences or other categories. The process of *synodality* outlines a path for each of us to go beyond stereotypes and what we hear about another group of people. Hopefully, there will be a moment in which each of us can listen to someone from a "new" group. A beauty of the process can be in the realization that, whatever groups we belong to, many of us have similar questions, hopes and dreams.

Recently, Pope Francis consecrated Russia and Ukraine to the Immaculate Heart of Mary in communion with the bishops throughout the world. A part of the prayer of consecration acknowledged our own sins before God, including when "we grew indifferent and caught up in our own selfish needs and concerns." May we develop listening hearts whose only concern is the salvation of all souls, especially those in most need of God's mercy.

**Associate State Chaplains Message:**

Brothers: On March 25<sup>th</sup> the Holy Father with all our bishops consecrated the World, and especially Russia and Ukraine, to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. This is a spiritually significant day for the Church; but it is only the beginning for the Laity of the Church, and there for, the Knights of Columbus in Texas have work to do! The Holy Father has done his part and now it falls on us to complete what our Lady asked through Sister Lucia; namely, to carry out the consecration of ourselves to the Immaculate Heart of Mary. Like a loaf of bread, this takes particular ingredients, actions, and time. It cannot be rushed, substituted, or left incomplete. Our Lady at Fatima has asked for five consecutive firsts Saturdays of the month in which we:

1. **Make a good Confession** that week, so that on the first Saturday we: 2. **Receive Holy Communion**, and offer it up in reparation to the blasphemies against Mother Mary. 3. **Pray the Rosary** any of the Mysteries (5 decades) and 4. **Spend 15 minutes with an image of our Lady** thinking about one of the teachings from the Mysteries of Mary's Rosary and teachings. This makes each of the five Saturday's a day of reparation, learning, and imitation the Immaculate Heart of Mary. The Five Saturdays correspond to the Church's teachings about the Blessed Virgin Mary which have been blasphemed or rejected by many. The Knights of Columbus affirm, teach, and defend these teachings in our daily living:

**1<sup>st</sup> Month: The Immaculate Conception** *The Archangel Gabriel echoed God's words in addressing her as "Hail, Full of Grace."* She pondered on what this greeting might mean. We too ponder it as the teaching of her immaculate conception, meaning that she was preserved by prevenient grace from the stain of original sin and remained immaculate by being fully receptive to the word of God from the moment of her conception until her Assumption. She not only kept all things in her heart but also conceived the Son of the Most High by the Overshadowing of Holy Spirit.

**2<sup>nd</sup> Month: The Perpetual Virginity of Mary** *While on the Cross Christ said, "There is your Son, There your Mother."* Jesus uses contractual language here as he about to die. The only way he can use this language is if St Joseph has died and there are no biological, in-law, or step brother's to take care of her or any sisters (no sisters are mentioned either). Christ then was an only Child and Mary was a virgin when she conceived him. He did not spurn her Virginity, for as light passes a pane of glass so too the Light from On High entered this world through Mary in Nazareth and Bethlehem.

**3<sup>rd</sup> Month: Mary Mother of God** *Elizabeth, filled with the Holy Spirit, called her, "The Mother*

*of My Lord.*” As Christ shares His son-ship with us through Holy Baptism so too the Father extends his love and authority to Mary at the Incarnation. Christ fully submits in his person both divine and human natures to Mary’s maternity at the Annunciation. This further elucidates his love and submission at Holy Communion as he taught at Capernaum and the Last Supper to, “take and eat.” The Rosary’s Mysteries also help us meditate on Jesus and Mary’s tender bond of love.

**4<sup>th</sup> Month: The Devotions to Marian Apparitions, Images, and Titles** “Therefore, since we are surrounded by so great a cloud of witnesses, let us rid ourselves of every burden and sin that clings to us and preserver in running the race that lies before us while keeping our eyes fixed on Jesus, the leader and perfecter of the faith. “Hw2:1 Mary is the greatest in the cloud of witnesses that model, motivate, and direct us to Christ who calls us to live in His father’s Love as Sons. The devotions and images of Mary model for us perfect Christian Discipleship in any culture, time, and circumstance.

**5<sup>th</sup> Month: Mary, Mother of the Church** *While on the Cross Christ said, “There is your Son, There your Mother.”* As the Mother of the Church, we are asked to teach and raise our children to approach Mary as their mother too. They are to strive to make their souls immaculate from sin and radiant with virtue. She who follows Christ, is a remodel to look up to and follow to imitate. Her maternal love is universal and inclusive. Many go without knowing her love, protection, or wisdom.

Our love for Mary is deeply rooted in our DNA as a Knight of Columbus, her Rosary is our weapon against sin, despair and atrophy. It teaches us holiness in joyful, sorrowful and glorious experiences. It is entrusted to us by the Order “to carry it always, and pray it as often as you can.” Christ commanded us at the Foot-Washing of Holy Thursday: Love, as I Love. So wee to love Mary as our Mother just as Christ did. Christ further rooted this at Calvary: “there is your Son; there is your Mother.”

So let us unite as Texas Knights in prayer and fulfill our Mother’s request at Fatima on **April 2<sup>nd</sup>, May 7<sup>th</sup>, June 4<sup>th</sup> and July 2<sup>nd</sup>**. *Holy Mary of the Immaculate Heart; pray for us!*

### **Star Council Awards**

The Star Council Awards Team sent out nearly 700 individual emails this past week to Grand Knights about the exact steps they need to take to earn Star Council by June 30. The District Deputies and Diocesan Deputies were copied. Covered for each council was the following:

- Membership needs
- Fraternal Benefit Nights needed
- Forms Needed (365, 1728 and SP-7). Supreme has just started accepting the SP-7 and I expect this will start showing up on the 4/1 Star Tracker
- Supreme per capita - this was just added for Jan - Jun
- Safe Environment status
- Who needs to finish, recommendations and updates on men whose credentials expire before June 30

**We have 3 months to make our goals to not only get back to the Circle of Honor but also exceed 170 Star Councils in Texas!**

- **Forms**
  - 365 - we are missing 137 from active councils as of 3/24/22.
  - 1728 - we are doing better with submitting Form 1728. We are missing 196 reports as of 3/24/22. We have received 29 forms in the last few days!
  - SP-7 - start sending these in NOW! Ensure you send a copy to your District Deputy and the State Office [forms@tkofc.org](mailto:forms@tkofc.org). We will review for accuracy and completeness. Five councils lost Star Council last year because no one was able to review the forms and provide guidance!
- **Fraternal Benefit Nights** - OWN the credit process! If you are certain you are not being properly credited, talk to your General Agent and / or send the completed form to him!
  - There will be some statewide opportunities in May and June. Stay tuned for more details from the General Agent Team
- **Supreme per capita** - statements were **NOT** sent out so councils must look at Officers Online, Reports, Financial Statement 3/1/22. These should be paid by April 6 to avoid suspension
- **Safe Environment as of 3/17/22**
  - 235 Councils are now listed as compliant but there is a catch. There must be 3 men fully cleared and the Grand Knight is the only one who can hold an additional role. Supreme's reports cannot pick that up so we need to self police this.
  - 29 of these councils are really non-compliant. Detailed communications have been sent on how to fix each council

- 613 Grand Knights are COMPLIANT
- 55 are NON-COMPLIANT
- 25 are pending meaning they are in the window for training
