Brother Knights we ended this past fraternal year strong; you did an exceptional job regarding recruitment and membership growth. Your hard work brought Texas back into the Circle of Honor (COH) for the third consecutive year.

Let us continue with this momentum into this 2023-2024 fraternal year and work to go into the COH for a fourth consecutive year.

This fraternal year's Membership Intake Goal is set at 5025. Growing our membership this fraternal year will take all our collective efforts. Ensure you are scheduling Exemplifications of Charity, Unity, and Fraternity now.

To get this fraternal year off to a strong "Jump Start", please ensure you share the following July Only incentives with all our Councils.

Grand Knight and Membership Director - Jump Start Incentives

Every GK and MD whose Council brings in at least 5 new members, for the 2023-2024 Fraternal Year, as set by the Supreme Council, between July 1-31, 2023, will receive a Texas KofC Membership Cap.

Every GK and MD whose Council achieves 100% of their Membership Intake Goal, for the 2023-2024 Fraternal Year, as set by the Supreme Council, between July 1-31, 2023, will each receive a Texas KofC Membership Jacket.

Council - Jump Start Incentives

Every Council which achieves or exceeds their Council Membership Intake Goal, as set by the Supreme Council, between July 1-31, 2023, can earn the incentive rewards as listed below. The more your Council grows, the more you can earn.

- 100% of goal earn KofC Table Covering
- 200% of goal above earned items plus KofC Flagship Banner
- 300% of goal earn a \$300.00 gift card
- 400%+ of goal earn a \$400.00 gift card

District Deputy - Jump Start Incentive

Every District Deputy who achieves or exceeds the percentages listed below towards their total District Intake Goal (not the goal set for the Star District Award), as set by the Supreme Council for all assigned Councils, in your District on July 1, 2023, between July 1-31, 2023, can earn the incentives as listed below. The more you aid your assigned councils grow, the better the swag you can earn.

- 30% of goal: Texas KofC Recruiter Cap
- 75% of goal: Texas KofC Recruiter Polo Shirt
- 100% of goal: Texas KofC Recruiter Jacket

NOTES:

A jurisdiction (Council, District) must bring in a minimum of 5 new members to qualify. A council can only earn one of the gift card incentives, not both.

A Council must be current on their Supreme and State Per Capita Assessments to qualify for the incentive(s) earned.

A District Deputy will earn the incentive associated with the highest percentage of assigned goal achieved.

A District Deputy must ensure their assigned Council is current on their Supreme and State Per Capita Assessments to qualify for the incentive earned.

District Deputies be ready to assist your councils with their plans for this fraternal year. Remember Programs and Membership go Hand-in-Hand. Please ensure council leaders are trained on how to plan and execute effective membership drives. Ensure key KofC Leaders are engaged in the planning and executing of the drives. Plan and Schedule Exemplifications of Charity, Unity, and Fraternity to support these drives. Communicate any changes regarding Membership and Star Council requirements.



Star Council Awards

Congratulations to all for finishing out 2022-2023 strong. While we await the results from Supreme regarding Star Councils, now is the time to lay the groundwork for a successful coming Fraternal Year.

1. Submit Report of Officers Chosen Form 185 and Service Program Personnel Form 365. These forms are vitally important to be submitted as soon as possible. They were due no later than June 30. Make sure to e-mail copies to your District Deputy and the State Office at forms@tkofc.org.

The easiest way to submit these forms is online. The following two links explain how to do this, as well as provide a PDF form. But please be aware e-mailing a filled-out PDF to Supreme slows down the whole process.

- 2. **Schedule and hold your annual planning meeting**. Planning out the coming Fraternal Year is a great way for councils to ensure success. Plan out your programs, fund raisers, and membership drives early in the fraternal year to make sure you hit your goals, one of which should be to attain the Star Council award.
- 3. Attend your Diocesan Conference. This conference is a great way to learn more about what is going on with the Knights at the Diocesan and State level. You'll pick up all sorts of great ideas on how to make your own council stronger and more dynamic.
- 4. **Get your Grand Knight and Directors Safe Environment Compliant**. It is vitally important to get the Grand Knight, Program, Community and Family Directors safe environment compliant within 30 days of Form 365 submittal. Community and Family Directors must also submit to a background check.

If the directors are not SE compliant withing 30 days, they will be removed from their post. Even if the "due date" on the training e-mail gives a date more than 30 days away, the director can still be removed after 30 days.

So, your objectives in July are: Get Forms 185 and 365 submitted, hold planning meeting, attend diocesan conference, and get GK and directors SE compliant. Do these things to get your council off to a great start in 2023-2024.

Texas State Council Charities:

Brother Knights,

Our Fraternal Year, 2022-23, is now over and State Charity results will soon be published. I can say with confidence that we will end up with over \$950,000 in funds raised despite the high participation in the affiliate program. This will be an impressive 117% of goal! Of particular note, NINE Diocese have already surpased 100% of their Charity Goal, something that has never happened here in Texas. Please congratulate the following Diocese in order of percent attainment:

- Fort Worth 293%
- Dallas 125%
- Laredo 108%
- Tyler − 107%
- Galveston / Houston 105%
- El Paso − 104%
- Victoria 101%
- Beaumont 100.6%
- Lubbock 100%

It is time to now set our sights on the upcoming year. Your District Deputies will be bringing Charity Pins to your meetings for only \$20 each. These DO COUNT towards your council goal! Speaking of, you can expect that State Charity and State per Capita invoices will be mailed the third week in July. Thank you in advance for taking care of these quickly!

Remember that 70% of these contributions go back to each Bishop for the Charity of his choice. ALL dollars over 100% - 100% of these go back to the Bishop!

Great work with the American Wheelchair Foundation with one month to report! YOU have donated nearly \$846,000 through May! This is already \$110,000 over last year with one more month to report. Each wheelchair affects up to ten lives and so far this amounts to 5,640 wheelchairs. Simply outstanding! Even if you do not host a wheelchair drive this upcoming year, please budget for at least \$150 to provide one wheelchair. This does make a difference!

AMERICAN WHEELCHAIR MISSION

The First Lady has adopted the American Wheelchair Mission as her charity of choice and a new order form as been designed to show these contributions to the program (available for download on the Texas State Website, tkofc.org). Through April 30, 2023 the wheelchair program raised \$789,583.92 and these funds will purchase more than 5,263 wheelchairs. We are ALREADY ahead of last years 12 month total with 2 FULL months of reporting to go! OUTSTANDING! Below is a breakdown, by Diocese, of the contributions received so far this year:
