Faithful Scribe's Script

SK Faithful Scribe Joe O'Connor: When we think of April, our thoughts turn to Easter, when our Savior triumphed over death through His Resurrection. However, April also recalls a pivotal period in our Nation's history that spanned five Aprils: the Civil War, fought by the Union first to keep the Country together and later to abolish slavery while the Confederate States fought for states' rights to maintain slavery as their economic engine. While considering the contemporary and politically contentious subject of reparations to descendants of former slaves, keep in mind that 360,000 Union soldiers (including nearly 40,000 Black soldiers) died to end slavery in the United States. Recalling the last refrain from the Battle Hymn of the Republic: "Glory, glory, hallelujah! Our God is marching on." [See the inset and article on page 2.] We wish all Sir Knights, their fellow Knights, and their families a very Blessed and Happy Easter! Jesus Christ is Risen, Alleluia! Vivat Jesus!

all Masses at Queen of Peace Church.



Thirteenth Amendment of the United States Constitution

Section 1. Neither slavery nor involuntary servitude, except as a punishment for crime whereof the party shall have been duly convicted, shall exist within the United States, or any place subject to their jurisdiction.

Section 2. Congress shall have power to enforce this article by appropriate legislation.



The American Civil War spanned across five Aprils, from April 1861 when Fort Sumter, South Carolina was bombarded, to the Battle of Appomattox Courthouse in Virginia which led to the surrender of the Army of Northern Virginia. The 620.000 Americans who died in the Civil War eclipsed the 405,300 Americans killed in World War Two, and dwarfed the 25,000 who died in the eight-year American Revolutionary War. The Civil War ended with a reunified Country and the abolition of slavery. While heralded as the savior of the Union, President Lincoln considered the Emancipation Proclamation of January 1, 1863 to be his greatest achievement. Later, he worked tirelessly to get the Thirteenth Amendment passed in Congress to end slavery throughout the United States. [See the critically-acclaimed 2012 movie *Lincoln* to see the obstacles he had to overcome.] The Senate passed it in August 1864 and the House passed it in January 1865. On February 1, 1865, Lincoln approved the Joint Resolution of Congress submitting the Thirteenth Amendment to the State legislatures. [See box to left.] Tragically, in April 1865 Lincoln was assassinated, depriving the South of a benevolent President ("...with malice toward none and charity for all..."). The necessary three fourths of the States ratified it by December 6, 1865, an achievement Lincoln did not live to see. The Fourteenth Amendment, adopted on July 9. 1868, made the former slaves United States citizens. The Fifteenth Amendment, adopted on February 3, 1870 gave them the right to vote.


