Who Was Saint Valentine?

Saint Valentine (Valentinus) was a thirdcentury priest in the Roman empire who ministered to persecuted Christians. He was martyred and buried in a Christian cemetery on Via Flaminia in Rome in 269 AD on February 14, which was established as the Feast of Saint Valentine in 496 AD by Pope Gelasius I. The



Catholic Encyclopedia mentions three different Saint Valentines in connection with February 14: One was a Roman Priest, another was the Bishop of Temi, and the third was martyred on the same day along with companyions in the Roman Province of Africa. Arrested for evangelizing, Valentinus was sent to the Emperor Claudius III whom he tried to convert to Christianity. The Emperor condemned him to death. While waiting to be executed, Valentinus wrote a note to a girl whose blindness he had cured. The note was signed "from your Valentine" which is said to have "inspired today's romantic missives."



God's Love: Unchanging, Unending, Unconditional! (© Andrew Womack Ministries, 2019) "God is love, and whoever remains in love remains in God and God in him" (1 John 4:16, New American Bible (Revised Edition)). God's love for us was the subject of the late Pope Benedict XVI's first encyclical, Deus Caritas Est ("God Is Charity"). The first part of Pope Benedict's encyclical dealt with God's love while the second part addressed love of neighbor; hence, there is need for the Church to show God's love through works of charity to others. Pope Benedict noted that ""there is a certain relationship between love and the Divine; love promises infinity, eternity-a reality far greater and totally other than our everyday existence." He also noted that the Shema, a fundamental prayer of the Israelites, implies that "God loves man" and that He "loves with a personal love." Pope Benedict pointed out Old Testament events that showed "God's passionate love for his people-for humanity—is at the same time a forgiving love." Pope Benedict then turned to the New Testament where Jesus Christ is "the incarnate love of God" and that Christ's death on the Cross "is the culmination of that God turning against himself in which he gives himself in order to raise man up and save him. This is love in its most radical form. By contemplating the pierced side of Christ (cf. 19:37), we can understand the starting point of this Encyclical Letter: "God is love" (1 Jn 4:8)." Pope Benedict concluded Part I of his Encyclical by stating: "Love is "divine" because it comes from God and unites us to God: through this unifying process it makes us a "we" and transcends our divisions and makes us one, until in the end God is "all in all" (1 Cor 15:28)." In his general audience on June 14, 2017, Pope Francis said "God's first step towards us is that of an anticipated and unconditional love. God loves first." He also stated "God loves us because He Himself is love, and love tends to spread and gives by its nature. God does not even tie his benevolence to our conversion; if anything this is a consequence of God's love."

2023 March for Life in Las Cruces

On January 28, the 2023 March for Life was held in Las Cruces, NM. The March began with a Rally in Plaza de Las Cruces, attended by several hundred people from Las Cruces, other



parts of New Mexico, and El Paso. About a dozen El Paso Knights were seen, including Knights on Bikes and several Sir Knights who attended the Pro-Life Holy Hour later on at Our Lady of Assumption Church in El Paso [see page 5]. Pro-abortion protestors mingled with the crowd holding their posters, some of which were obscene. (Photo: Sir Knight FS Joe O'Connor) Taking the stage at the March for Life Rally, Bishop Mark Seitz gave a stirring speech about how abortion diminshes the personhood of women in our society. Bishop Seiz was followed by Kelly Lester, a former abortion



worker, who said that the "saddest place on earth" was the abortion center's recovery room filled with women who regretted their abortions. Leading the March for Life, Bishop Seitz was joined by Las Cruces Bishop Peter Baldacchino, several Priests and Christian Pastors. 2023 March for Life in Las Cruces (Continued)



After the Rally at Plaza de Las Cruces concluded, the March for Life began, led by the clergy present. The March for Life did not receive a parade permit from the City of Las Cruces, so the marchers had to use the sidewalks. (Shown above was the end of the marchers; front was 2 blocks ahead). (Photo: SK Joe O'Connor) First stop on the March was the Las Cruces City Hall (to left of the picture). The marchers stopped on the City Hall's front sidewalk to pray. Marchers heard the pray-



ers by listening to an audio conference line that they called in using their cellphones. (The clergy leaders were in the far right group in the picture above. Approximately four fifths of the marchers were shown in foreground and background.) Knights, mostly from El Paso, served as road guards for the March. The remaining one fifth of the marchers are shown next to the front entrance of Las Cruces' City Hall. In addition to not granting the March a parade permit, there were no police officers seen throughout the March, unlike El Paso Marches for Life in past years. As the marchers approached the nearby abortion center, one young woman was seen dressed in Antifa-style black, standing on a car next to the marchers' sidewalk. She did not bother the marchers. Fortunately, she was the only Antifa-dressed person the marchers faced. CatholicVote.org has reported that at least 80 pregnancy resource centers and pro-life groups have been attacked and vandalized since a draft Supreme

Court opinion overturning Roe v. Wade was leaked in early May. Such attacks have continued. The only arrests made so far were in Florida. There, a man and woman were arrested for three of these attacks. The woman's social media accounts showed an affiliation with Antifa. (Photo: Sir Knight Faithful Scribe Joe O'Connor)
