Faithful Scribe's Script

SK Faithful Scribe Joe O'Connor: When we hear of Medieval scholars who kept the knowledge of Western Civilization alive by preserving Greek and Roman culture, we immediately think of the Irish monks who prepared the brilliantly illustrated Book of Kells, named after the monastery in Ireland where it was written, that contained the four Gospels of the New Testament. (For more information about the Irish monk's contributions, please read Thomas Cahill's "How the Irish Saved Civilization: The Untold Story of Ireland's Heroic Role from the Fall of Rome to the Rise of Medieval Europe.") But in the early 700s, in a northern English monastery in the Anglo-Saxon Kingdom of Northumbria, a Benedictine monk named Bede was performing original scholarly work entirely on his own, earning him the admiration of European kings and the Pope during his lifetime. Starting about 100 years after his death, he was called Bede the Venerable due to his holiness. See page 2 for a listing of his contributions to science, history and theology. See the inset on page 2 which describe his life of holiness and scholarship. Saint Bede the Venerable was canonized and named a Doctor of the Church by Pope Leo XIII in 1899.


SK Faithful Navigator Jesus Quintanar: [continued] Conducted 3 Chalice Presentations with Chalices given to a newly-ordained Priest and 2 new Parishes in Kenya. Donated a total of \$3,000 to 4 Seminarians and to Warriors to Lourdes. Hosted 1 Fourth Degree Exemplification for the El Paso Area. Participated in a total of 23 Fallouts, including 10 Vigil/Rosaries, 4 Funeral Masses, 2 Ordination Masses, 2 Eucharistic Processions, 1 Memorial Mass for Deceased Priests and Knights, 1 Memorial Mass for Blessed Father McGivnev. 1 Good Friday Procession, 1 Pro-Life Holy Hour, and 1 First Mass of Thanksgiving for a newly-ordained Sir Knight Priest. Published a monthly newsletter that highlighted patriotic and religious events and figures and included pages highlighting Assembly and Council Knights in action. Created a loan program for Sir Knights to purchase new regalia with 2 taking advantage of it so far. Supported 8 active-duty soldiers in Knights of Columbus golf outings, conducted 6 Flag Ceremonies at a retirement home populated by a large number of Veterans, planted 130 flags on the graves of Veteran Sir Knights/Knights, and held 2 Patriotic Essay contests involving 107 Catholic School students. Participated in 2023 March for Life in Las Cruces and 2024 March for Life in El Paso, as well as two Bishop's Hikes for Life up Mount Cristo Rey. Gained 10 new Sir Knights. Earned the Star Assembly Award for Fraternal Years 2021-2022 and 2022-2023.

The Life of Saint Bede the Venerable

Bede was born in March 672 near Jarrow in northern England. then part of the Anglo-Saxon Kingdom of Northumbria. At the age of seven, he was sent to a nearby monastery and in 682 joined the Monastery of Saints Peter and Paul at Jarrow where he lived for the remainder of his life. When he was 14. a plague broke out at the Monastery and only he and the Abbot survived. In 691 at the age of 19, he was made a Deacon at a time when the normal age to the Diaconate was 25. In 701 he wrote his first two works, the beginning of a scholastic career that included completing 60 books. In 702 at the age of 30 he was ordained a Priest and celebrated daily Mass for his Benedictine community. As a monk, Bede gave absolute priority to prayer, fasting and charitable hospitality. He regarded all other works as valueless without the love of God and of one's neighbor. Bede declined the request that he become Abbot to focus on his writing. In addition to his many publications, he taught hundreds of students at the Monastery and its school which became renowned throughout Britain. He was an accomplished singer and poet. He was invited to Rome by Pope Sergius I but never went. He died on the Feast of the Ascension, Thursday, May 25, 736, after he finished his translation of the Gospel of John. Bede became known as Venerable Bede in the 800s because of his holiness. Bede the Venerable is regarded as the greatest Anglo-Saxon scholar and the Father of English History. Bede was canonized by Pope Leo XIII in 1899 and named a Doctor of the Church.

Bede was considered the most learned man of his time and is esteemed by the Church as the Patron Saint of Scholars. Yet he did not consider learning as his life's purpose; rather, it was love: love for his students, love for his Benedictine community, love for the Anglo-Saxon people, love for his Church, and love for his God. When he wrote his first two works in 701, they were materials intended for the classroom. In his lifetime he taught hundreds of students. Bede celebrated daily Mass for his Benedictine community and led them in song as he was an accomplished singer and poet. His works, drawing upon Latin, Greek and Hebrew sources found in his monastery's library and materials provided by his correspondents from all over England and from Rome, were translated into Old English, the vernacular of Anglo-Saxons, the access of which, in his clear manner, brought his people closer to God. His 5-book Ecclesiastical History of the English People, considered his greatest work by many historians, chronicled the growth of the English Church. Bede's dating of Easter and Creation and his extensive use of Anno Domini (A.D.) in dating his historical accounts brought the birth of Christ to the forefront. Bede's biblical commentaries on the Old and New Testaments and homilies were widely distributed across Europe during the Middle Ages. On his death bed, just after completing his translation of the Gospel of John, Bede sang "Glory be to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Ghost" and then died. It was because of his theological writings that he earned the title of Doctor of the Church and why he was canonized.
