
hosted a CUF Exemplification, and supported the Queen of Peace Parish Festival (see pages 3-4).

Faithful Scribe's Script

SK Faithful Scribe Joe O'Connor: The Fourth Degree is the Patriotic Degree of the Knights of Columbus. What's the ultimate test of Patriotism? Most would say that highest form of Patriotism is being willing to die for your Country. Those of us who volunteered for combat did not have a death wish but we felt that our Country was more important than ourselves. The strength of a Nation is reflected in the degree of Patriotism found among its citizens. We can see how Patriotic the vast majority of Ukrainians are today in volunteering to defend their Country against Russian invaders; even those who have been wounded—some with amputations—make every effort to get back into the fight. While the World's admiration shines upon them, many peoples including Americans—are not willing to fight for their Country. The inset on page 2 looks at a survey of Patriotism by country. As Fourth Degree Knights, we have an obligation to promote Patriotism among our fellow Americans to strengthen our Country as it defends Liberty.

SK Faithful Navigator Jesus Quintanar: [continued] be more specific—we should focus on our Third Degree Knights, who tend to be younger and some who are victims of an educational system that shuns Patriotismsome schools even consider wearing an American flag shirt as racist! One way to engage our Third Degree Knights is to invite them to participate in our Patriotic Projects. This has already happened in the case of our Flag Ceremonies where several Franklin Mountains Council 12160 Knights participated. We should continue to invite them to participate in this Project. Other Patriotic Project participation opportunities include helping plant flags on the graves of Veteran Knights and Sir Knights who were members of their Councils, grading Saint Matthew Catholic School students' Patriotic Essays, and shepherding active-duty soldiers supported by the Assembly in the October Golf Outing run by Franklin Mountains Council 12160. As Leaders in their Councils. Sir Knights could encourage their Councils to sponsor patriotic essay contests for children in their Parishes, support Patriotic Rosaries, help the Disabled American Veterans plant flags at Fort Bliss National Cemetery on Patriotic holidays, and be involved in the annual El Paso Veterans Day Parade. Lastly, we should encourage all Sir Knights and Knights to exercise the most precious gift possessed by an American citizen—the right to vote! God Bless America! Vivat Jesus!

Would you be willing to die for your Country? In August 1776, General George Washington was in a jam. His Army had just been beaten by the British in the Battle of Long Island and he was desperate to find out where the British were going to invade Manhattan which the Continental Army currently held. He called for a spy to go behind British lines. Only Captain Nathan Hale volunteered. He knew that if he was caught as a spy it meant certain death. Accounts vary on how was discovered but the end result was the same: Death by hanging. The British officers present at the hanging were impressed by Hales' composure as he met his fate.

Would you be willing to fight for your Country? In 2015, WIN/Gallup International, polled 62,398 people in 64 countries and asked if they would be willing to fight for their homelands: 61% said "Yes" while 27% said no. An abridged list of the survey results are shown in the box in the lower left of this page.

Would you stay and fight or flee if invaded? In March 2022, a Quinnipiac University poll asked 1,374 Americans if their Country was invaded like Ukraine would they stay and fight or flee the Country: 55% said they would fight while 38% said they would leave.

What can we do to promote Patriotism? As Fourth Degree Knights what can we do to promote Patriotism in our Community and in our Nation? First, focus on the younger generations who often lack patriotic education. Second, promote a learning of American history including how the Country got its independence, the system of Republican government with checks and balances set up by the Constitution unique to the world at that time, how Slavery common around the world was overcome in America through our Civil War and Reconstruction, and how the rights of minorities and women have been advanced. Third, educate others in civics: How Americans elect their government officials, how laws are made, and how the Courts adjudicate differences. Fourth, show how immigrants from many lands legally came to our Country, assimilated as Americans, and achieved their dreams for success and happiness. Fifth, recount how, in the First and Second World Wars, and in later Wars, Americans fought for freedom for our Country and for other nations as well. Sixth, show how America's success as a Nation came from a reliance on God: In God We Trust.
