Recruitment is a simple process. What have we learned? It is not easy for many of our members to do.

If we are to continue to offer the opportunity of membership to every practical Catholic gentleman, we must be prepared to share the benefit of membership in our Order, at every opportunity. Recruiting new members into our Order is in fact ... a DUTY! You do not have to be a polished recruiter with a prepared marketing slogan or recruiting statement.

Inviting a member of the parish to join is as simple as sharing your personal story. Share why you joined the Knights of Columbus. Successful councils:

A. Have active recruitment programs throughout the fraternal year!

B. Utilize Supreme and State resources and materials (Many of them are FREE!!)

C. Schedule, Host, and conduct Exemplifications of Charity, Unity, and Fraternity!!!

If every Council would take on the mantra, One Member, Per Council, Per Month, this could easily be achieved. Last year y'all did an outstanding Job. The State Council once again made it into the Circle of Honor (COH)! We have over 800 councils in Texas and around 380 councils did not take the opportunity to recruit any new members ... let that sink in. Let us get every council active and get State into COH for a third year in a row! I will be calling no less than twice a year to see where your membership Team can assist with your recruitment efforts. If there is anything you need, please do not hesitate to contact me. MEMBERSHIP RETENTION

Brothers, this past year has been one that has seen significant changes, not only to our lives, but the way we perceive our members. Now, more than ever it is necessary to maintain contact with ALL our members, regardless of their due's status or involvement in the council.

Remember, our councils are NOT businesses, but rather enclaves where members and their families gather to promote the ideals and goals of the Order and of our Faith. Therefore, those principles of Charity, Unity, & Fraternity need to be extended to those who may not be able to fend for themselves or who may need to be guided back to the fold.

Throughout this fraternal year there will be periodic updates sent to the District Deputies to help them work with their councils on keeping a strong active membership. Retention needs to be a PRO-ACTIVE council activity, not RE-ACTIVE.

Begin the fraternal year by making sure that ALL your councils have the updated forms that can be found on the State website at www.tkofc. org.

The Online Exemplification and the Council Exemplification for members now afford members and their families to become immediately immersed in the activities and programs of the council.

Remember, it takes STRONG Programs to help attract members - and ACTIVE Members to run programs.

A new fraternal year allows the councils to make adjustments to help them function in this time of change, and not just with Order changes.

- Set the council calendar for activities and meetings.
- Prepare a budget for operating expenses and revenues suggest a line item to assist brothers who are unable to pay their dues this
 year.
- CONTACT the membership. Use the Retention Committee along with the Chancellor for the council to contact the members not for dues collection – but to find out how the brother and his family are doing. Let the brother know about the calendar & budget.
- For new members, promote the Shining Armor Award.
- Promote the Insurance Program to Associate Members.
- A 4th Degree Insurance member is one that rarely has issues with 'retention'. Same holds true for a 3rd Degree Insurance member.

Now comes the more difficult part of this process. YOU as District Deputies, Council Grand Knights and Financial Secretaries, Council Membership and Program Directors need to do one especially important thing...

Exemplification of Charity, Unity, and Fraternity

This new fraternal year will see Texas grow in unprecedented membership growth. Our Ceremonials will form these men in the knowledge of our faith and the principles of our Order. Your Councils remain in control of their own destiny regarding Ceremonials. Each Council may form their own team to conduct the Exemplification of Charity, Unity, and Fraternity. Districts may choose to form a Team to support their needs as well. You may also choose to form Diocesan Team(s) to provide ceremonial support for all the above.

Online exemplifications remain available through the Supreme Council to make this exemplification available to all and provide the resources to each of our Councils on the Supreme website. If you are not familiar with this resource, I encourage you to take a look. The web address listed here will take you to the Ceremonial Resource page on the Supreme website. https://www.kofc.org/en/for-members/resources/ceremonials. html?1tab=1tab0. Everything you need to know about the exemplification is on this page or the links that are located on this page. Take the time to explore it and get familiar with it, as it is a valuable resource and tool. Please be sure to share this information with your Council membership.

Grand Knights, I will be working to aid your Council's in putting their team together and schedule regular exemplifications as we move forward. District Deputies, you should set a goal to get a team(s) formed to support 100% of the Council's in your district. It's easy to overcome the objections, as the costs are low to start a team and the parts can be read. At a minimum, every district should have one Ceremonial Team formed to support the needs of the District. The forming of Diocesan teams has been highly successful and have been available to support various ceremonial needs across our great state.

The Exemplification itself is simple to set up, as there are only five spoken parts, those being:

- 1. Presiding Officer (Serves as Master of Ceremonies)
- 2. Chaplain (Leads Assembly in Opening and Closing Prayers)
- 3. Presenter on Charity (Teaches the Lesson on Charity and delivers the Discourse on the Rosary)
- 4. Presenter on Unity (Teaches the Lesson on Unity)
- 5. Presenter on Fraternity (Teaches the Lesson on Fraternity)
- In addition to the speaking parts, there are several supporting roles, those being:
- 1. Warden (Guides the Candidates and assists with the Lesson on Unity)
- 2. Investing Officer(s) (Presents Rosaries and Lapel Pins to the Candidates)
- 3. Financial Secretary (Registers Candidates and obtains the signature on the Constitutional Roll)
- 4. Field Agent (Meets and greets the Candidates and assists the Financial Secretary)

Members of the Ceremonial Team may conduct more than one of the above-listed roles.

The desire is for our Ceremonial Teams to make a great first impression on the Candidates, their families, and guests attending the ceremonial. The preferred dress for the Team members is a dark suit and tie. If the Team is not able to achieve this look, the next option would be dress pants, matching Council shirts and a sports coat. If the Team is not able to achieve this look, the next acceptable option would be dress pants and matching Council shirts. All members of the Team should wear the KofC Ceremonial Sash (yellow and white with Emblem of the Order).

Resources needed to properly conduct the Exemplification of Charity, Unity and Fraternity are minimal, those being:

- 1. Crucifix (12-18" in size)
- 2. Rosary (can be one of the candidate rosaries or a larger one)
- 3. Cable (used by the Warden during the lesson on Unity)
- 4. Fibers (distributed to the Candidates, by the Warden, during the lesson on Unity)
- 5. Degree Kits (#531) (enough to support the scheduled, as well as unscheduled, candidates)
- 6. Master script (10991) for use by the Team
- 7. Father McGivney Canonization Prayer cards (10502) (enough for all Candidates and guests)

The preferred location to present the Exemplification of Charity, Unity and Fraternity is in a Church but this ceremonial can be held in the Council Chamber or another suitable room, if it is not possible to hold it in the Church. Candidates, their families, friends, fellow parishioners, and anyone interested in learning more about the Knights are welcome to attend the Exemplification.

Depending upon the number of candidates, the exemplification will typically last no longer than thirty to forty minutes. To make the new members and their families feel welcome, be sure to schedule a social or dinner after the Exemplification. There should not be any talks at the conclusion of the Exemplification, as the social or dinner would be the appropriate time to recognize the Field Agent and the Grand Knight, if they wanted to say a few words to the group.

The Supreme Council has provided a copy of Frequently Asked Questions ("FAQ's") regarding this form of Exemplification of Charity, Unity, and Fraternity, which is seven pages in length and available in both English and Spanish. Both copies of the FAQ's, along with a copy of the Script in English and Spanish can be found at the Ceremonials link of the Supreme Council website (kofc.org).

Brothers, to summarize, be sure to encourage all Councils to form their Exemplification Team so we can get new candidates to full Knighthood as soon as possible. Please report dates for scheduled Exemplifications to your Diocesan Deputy, District Deputy, and the Ceremonials Chairman. This will ensure all Councils can be made aware of an upcoming ceremonial. There are several tools available including: Online prospect form (https://info.kofc.org/us.html), Online Membership (http://www.kofc.org/ un/joinus/en/membership.html), social media resources (Facebook, Twitter, Instagram) marketing campaigns, and online Form 100's. These resources are available to better meet the needs of Catholic gentlemen in this digital age.

An online member becomes a "Prospect" and is assigned to the local council he enters during the registration process. If an online member does not show a local council, he is "Unassigned" until someone identifies the council that is his best fit. Unassigned prospects can be assigned to the council by notifying me at my email: bigcheese10@austin.rr.com or contacting my cell: 512-657-3234.

Supreme independently communicates with online members weekly, with emails about education, programs, formation, and inviting them to an exemplification to become a 3rd degree member.

Local Brother Knights should also make a point to complement Supremes' emails by personally contacting the prospect, determining their interest in joining a local council, and supporting them on their journey to the 3rd degree.

A Council's online presence has been a proven method which should be in your war chest this fraternal year!

- Submit Form 136, Notice of Institution of a Council, Form 185, Elected Officers, Form 365, Program Directors, Financial Secretary Forms 101 & FS 103 – to the CG Team
- 11. Submit Form 137, Charter request to the CG Team
- 12. Formally Present Charter
- 13. Follow up, ensure sustainability

We are here to help with that process. The reactivation process for a dormant council pretty much mirrors that of starting a new council with a few exceptions. A Council was established in that parish at one time. We must get to the root cause of the suspension before the Council will be vibrant and beneficial to the Parish.

Reactivation District Deputy Checklist:

- 1. Contact the Pastor
- 2. Meet with existing Council Members
- 3. Contact the Diocesan Deputy & State Deputy and submit Form 133 "Notice of Intent" to establish a New Council
- 4. Conduct a Church Drive & get help from the General and Field Agents
- 5. Conduct informational meetings
- 6. Conduct initial Organizational Meeting and hold elections and Submit Form 185
- 7. Identify Financial Secretary, submit Form 101 & 103
- 8. Conduct a "CUF"
- 9. Submit Membership forms
- 10. SUBMIT ALL FORMS TO THE CG TEAM.
- 11. DD to Submit request for per capita debt forgiveness to State Deputy
- 12. Follow procedure for "Free Drops"
- 13. Follow up, ensure sustainability

We must contact all members of that council and request they transfer to the next closest council. Our team will be ready to assist in that activity. Let "Christ Be Our Light" to reactivate these Brother Knights to serve our parish and community better.

Council Retention

The mission of our Council Retention program is to ensure that all councils in Texas operate in good standing with the Supreme Council. This is accomplished when all councils pay their per capita charges on time and in full. Our goal is for all Brother Knights to enjoy the fraternal and many substantial rewards due them and their families as members in good standing of the Knights of Columbus.

Supreme will assess the per capita this fraternal year. Please ensure your councils do not delay submitting these payments. As a reminder, payments of the Supreme per capita do not require a council vote.

Spanish speaking Catholic men are seeking to become involved in their parishes. We, as the leaders of the Knights of Columbus, must be open and welcoming to our Spanish speaking Catholics within our parishes.

Our ultimate goal is to promote ethnic membership growth, growing the number of Spanish speaking councils and reactivating suspended Spanish speaking councils. Additionally, establishing a firm foundation of training to assure sustainability of all the Spanish speaking councils.

Round Tables

Knights of Columbus was founded in 1882 by Venerable Father Michael J. McGivney. He envisioned that every Catholic gentleman aged 18 and older could enjoy the benefits that the Knights of Columbus offers. Our Supreme Knight Patrick E. Kelly has challenged us to establish a Knights of Columbus presence in all Catholic Parishes and Missions. Currently in the State of Texas we have over 1300 parishes or missions in which only 817 have a Knights of Columbus Council. As Knights it is our responsibility to help other Catholic Gentlemen to experience the joys of our four Principles of the order: Charity, Unity, Fraternity and Patriotism, remembering that we as Knights are the hands and arms of the parish priests. Supreme has established a method to help us reach the goal of having Knights in each parish/mission in Texas. Round Tables were established to help us reach Catholic gentlemen enabling them to experience the joy of helping others.

Purpose of a Round Table

The purpose of having a Round Table is:

To actively engage Knights of Columbus members to aid the parish and sustain visible Catholic action through works of charity in every parish and mission throughout the Order, and in sustainable parishes to form the table into a fully functioning council." (Supreme)

Why Have A Round Table

Parish Round Tables are ideal to provide a Knights of Columbus presence and be of service to smaller parishes and missions, and to fill needs for ethnic development.

Round Tables help develop programs and events for parishes and missions that do not have Knights of Columbus. Round Tables help subgroups of parishes meet their goals.

Round Tables can become the MUSTARD SEED for a new Knights of Columbus Council.

Guidelines To Be Used To Establish A Parish Round Table

The Grand Knight surveys the area parishes to see who will benefit from a Round Table.

The Grand Knight and his Officers make a list of council members who belong to the area parishes. They will become part of the Round Table.

The Grand Knight informs members who belong to the designated parish that the order would like to set up a Round Table. The Grand Knight, Officers and Insurance Agents will explain to them the benefits of having a Round Table to the council. The Grand Knight and a chosen Knight parishioner will set up a meeting with the Pastor to offer help. During the meeting, the Grand Knight will explain how the Knights of Columbus can be of assistance and will emphasize that this is not a "one and done" opportunity but a chance to provide on-going assistance.

If the Pastor is not receptive to a Parish Round Table, the Pastor's decision is accepted, but the offer should be kept open in case things change.

If the Pastor is receptive, the Grand Knight appoints one Parish Round Table Coordinator for each designated Parish. The Grand Knight completes the Report of the Parish Round Table Coordinator (Form 2629) and submits it to Supreme with a copy to the District Deputy and State Round Table Coordinator. Link: https://www.kofc.org/en/forms/council/roundtable_coordinators2629_p.pdf

The Grand Knight will communicate Parish Round Table appointments to those involved and make announcements. The Parish Priest will select which projects or events the Round Table will complete. Once the Round Table exceeds 20 members and still has potential to grow, paperwork should be submitted to form a new Council.

Operating a Round Table

There are no elected officers to the Round Table, only an appointed Coordinator. The Pastor is involved as much as he wants to be, but the Round Table should not add to his workload. The Coordinator should maintain good communications with the priest. The Coordinator should seek help from current council members to accomplish Round Table projects. Annually, the Grand Knight and the Pastor will review the activities and effectiveness of the parish Round Table and Coordinator. If the Pastor desires a change of Coordinator or if the Coordinator resigns during the fraternal year, the Pastor and the Grand Knight make the selection of a new Coordinator.

Change of Pastor, the Grand Knight and the Coordinator explains the program and seek the new Pastor's support. The parish Round Table has no dues. Members continue to meet their financial obligation to their council.

The Name of the Parish Round Table

The parish name and city should be used in conjunction with the parish Round Table.

Communication

The Round Table Coordinator regularly reports on the activities of the parish Round Table at the business meetings of the sponsoring council. The parish Round Table projects should be announced in the parish, the Texas Knight (State Knights of Columbus Newspaper), Diocesan newspaper, Columbia, and Parish bulletins.

This form is used to report the Round Table Coordinator assigned to each parish and is signed by the Grand Knight. Only one coordinator can be assigned to a parish.

When the Parish Round Table Coordinator is changed, the Grand Knight notifies Council Growth, State and District Deputy, State Round Table Coordinator, and the outgoing coordinator with an updated Form #2629.

- See what the pastor would like to have done at his church.
- Parish is connected to a Council (has members of a parish in the Council).
- Select Coordinator for Round Table.
- Submit Form 2629 to Supreme, State, Director of Membership and Round Table Chairman.

STAR COUNCIL AWARD

The Star Council Award is earned by councils for outstanding achievement in the areas of membership, insurance, and service program activities. The criterion used for this award are the behaviors most seen in successful councils – growth in membership, focus on insurance programs, and a commitment to a variety of programs in the areas of Faith, Family, Community and Life.

All Councils should strive to earn this prestigious award every year. With proper planning and leadership, every council can do so.

To earn the Star Council Award:

- 1. Earn the **Father McGivney Award** for membership growth by June 30, 2024. The council quota can be found on the Membership tab in Officers Online. There is no application to complete for the Father McGivney Award, as the Supreme Council automatically determines eligibility. Goals are set at 6% growth with a minimum of 5 and maximum of 15.
- 2. Earn the **Founder's Award** for insurance growth by June 30, 2024. Each Council will schedule at least two Fraternal Benefits events for current and prospective members and their spouses during the fraternal year. Credit will be given for Fraternal Benefits events based on forms submitted to Supreme by the Grand Knight. Details of changes to this program will be forthcoming.
- Earn the Columbian Award for Faith in Action programs by June 30, 2024. Conduct at least four programs in each of the four Faith in Action categories of Faith, Family, Community, and Life. Columbian Award application can be submitted at: https://www.kofc.org/ en/forms/spa/invite.html?lang=en&form=SP7C.01
- 4. Complete and send other required forms to Supreme and the Texas State Office.
 - Submit the Service Program Personnel Report (Form 365) due by July 1, 2023. Form can be completed at: https://www.kofc.org/en/for-members/resources/forms/365.html
 - Submit the Annual Survey of Fraternal Activity (Form 1728) due by January 31, 2024. Form can be completed here: https://www.kofc.org/en/for-members/resources/forms/185.html

Forward the confirmation PDF copy to the Texas State Office.

- 5. **Safe Environment**. Be compliant with required training and background checks. Men in the following positions must complete Safe Environment training modules and may be required to provide authorization for a background check. These must be complete within 30 days of receiving an email from Supreme after appointment.
 - Grand Knight
 - Program Director
 - Family Director (background check required)
 - Community Director (background check required)
 - Columbian Squires Counselors (if applicable) (background check required)

Some positions also have access to the Praesidium Academy administration dashboard to view council compliance status. Once completed, training is good for three years.

The Service Program Personal (Form 365) will be recorded as received when the following required roles have been appointed - Program Director, Community Director, Family Director, Membership Director, and Retention Chairman. The Grand Knight can hold one Director position - however other unique men must hold the other Director roles.

Accurate emails must be reported. Praesidium will use these email addresses to send notifications to those men to complete Safe Environment training and to provide authorization for a background check. There should be no general email specific to council name, position, etc., - it must be a unique email address to the individual. The email the member will receive from Supreme will include their username and password to access the training website.

Safe Environment training can also be completed by those without Internet access. The Office of Youth Protection (OYP) can mail the training materials to a Knight. He then can read the training, complete the paperwork, and mail back in. Contact the OYP (info below) for more details.

The Star Tracker will provide training status as required to achieve 100% compliance. Grand Knights and District Deputies are expected to monitor these reports for Safe Environment Compliance for their councils. Grand Knights and District Deputies can also monitor progress in Officers Online. They should work to ensure that each council is 100% compliant.

Timeline is as follows:

- Once the completed Form 365 is received by Supreme an email will be sent to the men who need to complete training. Individuals will have 30 days to complete the training and provide background information. Those without Internet access need to contact the OYP.
- An email reminder will be sent after 2 weeks if not completed.
- If not completed within 30 days, the director positions are vacated and another individual needs to be assigned.
- Completing the online safe environment training modules shows commitment to protecting children and vulnerable members.
- DIOCESAN SAFE ENVIRONMENT REQUIREMENTS ARE UNIQUE AND SEPERATE FROM THE KNIGHTS. BOTH MUST BE COMPLETED.

6. Council must be current with Supreme Assessments twice during the year; prior to October 10, 2023, and April 10, 2024.

The Texas State Council provides a checklist in this Star Guide to help achieve Star Council, the Form TX21B – 2020. This form is also available for download on the Texas State Website.

STAR DISTRICT AWARD

District Deputies are also recognized for excellence by Supreme. Criterion for this award are:

- 1. Meet membership goal (70% of combined council quotas)
- 2. Meet insurance goal (50% or more of councils complete two required Fraternal Benefits events)
- 3. Submit District Deputy Report Form 944 for each of his councils prior to September 15
- 4. Have at least one council in the district earn Star Council

LONE STAR AWARDS

Texas also has awards above and beyond the Star Council Award: The Lone Star Award for Excellence and the Lone Star Award for Excellence with Distinction.

The requirements for the Lone Star Award for Excellence are:

- 1. Meet the Star Council Award criterion
- 2. Submit Form 185 by July 1, 2023
- 3. Pay State Per Capita by March 1, 2024
- 4. Meet State Charity Goal by June 30, 2024
- 5. Seat at least one delegate at the State Convention in Houston April 26-28, 2024
- 6. Submit Form 1295 Semi-Annual Audit by August 15, 2023 & February 15, 2024

The requirements for the Lone Star Award for Excellence with Distinction are:

- 1. Meet the Star Council Award criteria
- 2. Submit Form 185 by July 1, 2023
- 3. Pay State Per Capita by December 31, 2023
- 4. Meet State Charity Goal by December 31, 2023
- 5. Seat two delegates at the State Convention in Houston April 26-28, 2024

- 6. Submit Form 1295 Semi-Annual Audit by August 15, 2023 & February 15, 2024
- 7. Submit Form 10784 for Special Olympics by January 31, 2024
- 8. Submit at least one entry for a State Service Program Award or Family of the Year or Blessed Michael McGivney Award or Educational Grant by March 1, 2024

Please strive to keep the members of your Councils active by participating in the Programs set forth. This will ensure that your Council will continue its success and growth through membership and Fraternal actions. Catholic men enjoy, correction, They LOVE working together to support the needs of the Council, Parish, and Catholic Communities. Allowing the Programs gear to function, in union with all the other Directorships, as the sustainer of our Blessed Order we allow Christ to be Our Light to guide our Councils to attain Star Council.

Faith in Action

To have a successful vocations program, RSVP is just one component. The Vocations Handbook states the objective of our vocations program is Awareness, Climate and Motivation for vocations. RSVP is just a measurable item to judge Council participation. All seminarians and religious originating from your Diocese should receive support. This includes prayer, invitations to events, greeting cards and hopefully, monetary support, the RSVP program.

Your Council Faith Director should work with your Diocesan Vocations Chairman regarding the equitable implementation of the RSVP program. This is important as the rebate to the Council or Assembly for any seminarian or religious, stops when they have received \$2000.00 from any source claiming the \$100 per \$500 RSVP provided. Culture of Life

Congratulations on 20 years of Celebrating and Supporting the Culture of Life!

This is a call to all Knights to help create a Culture of Life in the state of Texas and to rid ourselves of the culture of death that is pushed into our lives. This is done through prayer, civic action, organizing and participating in Pro Life events, and through donations of funds to various Pro-Life ministries such as pregnancy resource centers and maternity homes throughout the state. Please feel free to contact me or anyone in my committee for help in any of these areas... we are here to serve you and to continue to make Texas the most Pro-Life state in the country.

The ACE Wings

The ACE in ACE Wings stands for – Pro-Life without Apology, without Compromise, without Exception. To earn the ACE Wings a Knight must do 5 public Pro-Life events – a guide to these events can be found on the ACE Wing form located online at tkofc.org. Please note that only certain events can be repeated, again this is outlined on the form itself. This year's premium event will be the Texas Rally for Life held in January in Austin. This event will count for 3 of the 5 events needed to earn the ACE Wings.

In the past the ACE Wings were often thought of as an award. Please never refer to it as an award – Each set of ACE Wings represents a child that was lost to abortion – and you cannot "win" this...!! Please simply refer to them as "ACE Wings" and please wear them often, not just to KofC Meetings.

It takes a real man, a brave Knight, to earn and wear the ACE Wings!

Please treat them with the same respect you would any blessed object – ACE wings are sent to you blessed. A guide for wearing the ACE Wings will be distributed to your Diocesan Pro-Life Chairman soon. He will distribute it to the rest of the Diocese.

The **Silver ACE Wings** (est. 2003) continue to be the foundation in which the Texas Knights show others that the lives of those children who were aborted would have mattered, that they would have enjoyed the same things we all enjoy. A Knight works 5 public Pro Life events and once completed turns in his paperwork to the State Culture of Life Chairman for his consideration. If a Knight earns the ACE Wings, he may elect to purchase a set for his wife and children (Children must be 10 years of age or older since these represent a child lost to abortion and they are blessed objects and must be treated with respect). The cost for the additional set of wings is \$7 each.

Special Forces ACE Wing (SFAW) (est. 2017). The SFAW is black with the gold precious feet in the middle. These are to be presented to Knights in a Council that are often on the front lines defending the preborn... these are the men a Council calls upon when a Pro-Life event needs to be staffed, when volunteers are needed for 40 Days for Life, when Marshals are needed to protect Marchers at the Texas Rally for Life, or any of the March for Life events held across the state... to name just a few items.

How do you get the SFAW? The Grand Knight, in cooperation with the Council Pro Life Chairman, can choose up to 10 members of their Council per year to receive the SFAW. The Council will submit a form to the State Culture of Life Chairman for his consideration. The cost of each wing will be \$5 – including shipping. The funds for the SFAW must be paid for in advance.

- The Knight must have already earned his Silver ACE Wings.
- · Spouses may also receive the SFAW if the Knight so elects. (\$5 cost)
- Children of Knights and Squires are NOT eligible to receive the SFAW, but they are still eligible to receive the Silver ACE Wings if a Knight so elects – the \$7 charge for these remains the same.

The Gold ACE Wings (2013) are part of our ACE Wings system to recognize those Knights (Knights only please – however consideration will be given to non-Knights on special cases – Abby Johnson is a Gold ACE Wing recipient) whose constant and fearless love for the preborn have helped babies to live and Pro-Life ministries to thrive. Gold ACE Wings are presented to Knights that have been recognized for their outstanding Pro-Life efforts year in and year out by the Diocesan Deputy in each of the 15 Diocese's in Texas. Each Diocesan Deputy is allowed to present up to two Knights and their spouses the Gold ACE Wings each year. The Gold ACE Wings can only be earned once. The Gold ACE Wing form is also available at www.tkofc.org.

Pregnancy Resource

Andrew Clark, Chairman

Saving lives by helping women choose life by giving them the opportunity to view their unborn children on ultrasound machines at pro-life pregnancy centers. This initiative is funded by Knights of Columbus state and local councils with matching grants from the Supreme Council's Culture of Life Fund. The Knights of Columbus work together as an organization to purchase ultrasound machines for qualifying pregnancy centers. Discounted prices for select machines are offered through preferred pricing agreements arranged by the Supreme Council. The list of preferred machines is provided to sponsoring councils after the pregnancy center is approved for funding by the local diocese and the Supreme Council. After the state and/or local council raises 50% of the cost, the Knights of Columbus Supreme Council will provide the other 50% to complete funding for purchase of an ultrasound.

Here are the steps for Ultrasound support for your identified Pregnancy Center

- Notify Andrew Clark, the State Ultrasound Chairman of your intention to participate in the Ultrasound Program.
- Form 10715 Must first be filled out and approved by the Diocesan Right to Life Office (Bishop's Office, not the KofC Diocesan Pro-Life Chairman).
- Once approved by Supreme, fundraising can begin.
- Once funds are raised Form 10716 needs to be filled out and signed by the State Deputy.
- Supreme BOD will vote on the funds and a check will be issued to the Pregnancy Resource Center usually takes 6 to 8 weeks once the 10716 is sent in.



Evangelization and Faith Formation Christ Be Our Light

One hundred and forty-one years ago, Fr. Michael McGivney along with the founding members of Council 1, San Salvador, began what today is the largest Catholic men's fraternal organization comprised of nearly 2 million men who are apart of 16,000 councils worldwide. Blessed McGivney had a number of reasons why he began the Knights of Columbus but chief among them was "to form its members in Catholic faith and virtue," and "to unite members in their Catholic identity and the practice of their Catholic faith" (Section 2, Charter Constitution and Laws of the Knights of Columbus). Allowing men to come together to pray, be formed in their Catholic faith and share in fraternity were of the upmost importance to our founder; whose zeal for the salvation of souls was a driving force to his life and ministry. Today, we as Catholic men, more than ever, are called to renew the vision of Blessed Fr. McGivney. To make Jesus Christ the source and summit of all that we do; and ensure our Catholic faith, missionary zeal, and the proclamation of the Kingdom of God permeates all aspects of council life and membership engagement.

As such, we want to reiterate 4 promises the Knights of Columbus make to all our Brother Knights and prospective Brothers:

- 1. To help all men grow in their relationship with Jesus Christ
- 2. To provide opportunities for men to serve Christ in His Church including being a missionary disciple
- 3. To provide opportunities for men to serve those most in need in their communities and around the world IN THE NAME OF CHRIST JESUS
- 4. A promise to provide protection and aid to widows and orphans through our insurance arm

Men today are hungry for faith centered content and fraternity that help them grow in faith and become better Catholic men, husbands, and fathers. We know that our Catholic parishes and families need men who are faith-filled leaders who strive to grow in holiness, knowledge, and disciple others towards the Kingdom of Heaven. We are firm in our understanding that this goal is accomplished through prayer, formation, and fraternity.

To aid in this mission of helping all men grow in their relationship with Jesus Christ and forming men in their Catholic faith; under the leadership and behest of our Supreme Knight Patrick Kelly, the Knights of Columbus have begun a comprehensive Evangelization and Faith Formation initiative. The purpose of the EFF initiative is three-fold, **Encounter**, **Strengthen**, and **Commission**. A life of faith begins with an **encounter** with Jesus Christ that calls us to repentance and a radical reorientation of our lives because of His immense love poured out upon the Cross. We then **strengthen** our relationship with God through our personal prayer, study to be formed in the Catholic faith and in holy virtue, and we share in a fraternal brotherhood that holds us accountable. Lastly, we respond and accept Christ's **commission** in Matthew 28:19-20, to be sent out as disciple makers, to share Jesus Christ with others so they may encounter God and His radical life giving love.

At the heart of every Knight of Columbus is a deep relationship with Jesus Christ, knowing that God loves us, He died for our sins and the need to radically reorient our lives to strive for Heaven. At the heart of every Knight of Columbus is our Catholic faith which invites us to seek holiness through our Baptism and daily prayer. At the heart of every Knight of Columbus is a desire to build the Kingdom of God by being a disciple of Jesus Christ; therefore, having the courage to share with others the Good News of Jesus Christ and His Church.

The first element of the Evangelization and Faith Formation initiative is this COR. COR is Latin for heart and the root word for courage. COR exists to form and strengthen Catholic men in faith and virtue as missionary disciples by drawing them into a deeper relationship with Jesus Christ through prayer, formation, and fraternity. The goal of each COR is to provide the opportunity for men to encounter Christ, to strive to be more Christ like, to strengthen our bonds of brotherhood, and to prepare for the courageous mission of evangelization.

COR essentials:

Additional gathering for the men focusing on prayer, formation and fraternity

Optional

Open to all men of the parish

Held at minimum monthly

Three key and required elements:

Prayer: reciprocal relationship between God and man where man responds to God's invitation then encounters the Creator

Formation: lifelong process where we become more like Christ through knowledge and understanding of the Catholic faith.

All correspondence and checks sent to the state office should be clearly identified with the council number and the person's name and title when mailing the correspondence.

Checks should be clearly marked as to their purpose. If the check is for payment of a Texas State Council invoice or billing, kindly return a copy of the invoice or billing so that your payment can be properly recorded.

Any changes of council officers, addresses, phone numbers and email addresses should be emailed immediately to the state office at forms@tkofc. This ensures that all state office correspondence reaches the right people.

Study the Texas State Council Star Guide. It has a preliminary listing of the Texas State Council personnel, a description of current fraternal year programs and state council award criteria.

Report of Officers in Member Management should be completed and filed promptly by the Financial Secretary each year after election of council officers. This form is due at Supreme on July 1st. It is important that a copy of this form be sent to the State Office at forms@tkofc.org. The State Office uses the information to maintain a database of all council Grand Knights and Financial Secretaries, and it is from this database that the Texas State Council Directory is created.

Follow the due dates marked on each form. Two items that deserve your attention:

State Council Service Program Awards Entry Form: Each council should report their best activity in each category and submit your entry by March 1st to the Programs Director.

Each council should file the Columbian Award Application to the Supreme Council well before the June 30th due date.

Supreme Council Office: Most of your printed materials and visual aids are supplied by the Supreme Office. For questions, call the Webbmason toll-free line, 1-833-591-7770. In addition, you can email Supplies Online at customersupport@ webbmason.com. A dedicated customer service team, specific to the Knights of Columbus, will answer that line. They work Monday through Friday from 8:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m., Eastern time.

If you are a grand knight, financial secretary, faithful navigator, faithful comptroller, district deputy, or state council officer and are having issues with accessing Officers Online, please call the Supreme Council Customer Service Department at 1-800-380-9995 for assistance. They will operate Monday through Friday from 8:00 a.m. to 5:00 p.m., Eastern time.

For military councils, please contact Mary Beth Stankiewicz at marybeth.stankiewicz@kofc.org to order supplies.

Communication is important. If you have a problem or do not understand something, please contact your District Deputy or Diocesan Deputy. Remember that your State Office will also help you or see that you receive assistance.
